

Next Step 2024 Post-School Pathways

Lee Street State Special School

This is a summary of the post-school pathways of students from Lee Street State Special School who completed Year 12 and gained a Senior Statement in 2023. The results are from the *Year 12 Completers Survey*, which is conducted approximately six months after students completed Year 12.

78.6% response rate

22 out of 28 Year 12 completers from this school responded to the 2024 survey. Results may not be representative of all Year 12 completers at this school.

Post-school pathways



In 2024, 14 Year 12 completers from Lee Street State Special School continued in a meaningful postschool pathway.



Two respondents were participating in further education or training, both in campus-based study.




Work was a pathway for five respondents, either in open employment (one), supported employment (one) or unpaid or volunteer work (three).




There were seven respondents not in education, training or employment but were attending a day service.

The post-school pathways of Year 12 completers from special schools were categorised into eight *main pathways*. Respondents who were in education, training or employment as well as attending a day service were reported in their education, training or employment pathway. These pathways are defined on the next page.

Post-school pathway categorisation

Education and Training	
Campus-based study ^{a b}	Studying at Certificate I, II, III, IV, Diploma, Advanced Diploma, Associate Degree or Bachelor Degree level (excluding apprentices and trainees).
Apprenticeship or Traineeship b	Employment-based apprenticeship or traineeship.
Employment	
Open employment ^b	Undertaking full or part-time work in a non-supported employment environment and not in an education or training category.
Supported employment b	Undertaking full or part-time work in a supported employment environment and not in an education or training category.
Unpaid or volunteer work ^b	Undertaking unpaid work—including vocational placements, internships, work experience and trials—or volunteer work.
Attending day service	
Attending day service	Attending a day service one or more days per week and not in an education, training or employment category.
Not in a meaningful pathway	
Seeking work	Looking for work and not in education, training, employment or day service.
NILFET	Not in education, training, employment, day service or seeking work.
